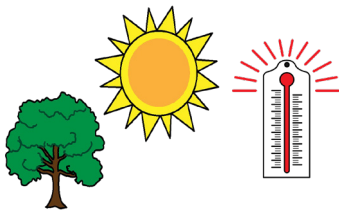
About this book

This book is about how to get your home ready for bushfires.



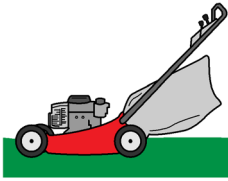
Bushfires are more likely to happen in the hotter times of the year.

in the hotter times of the year.

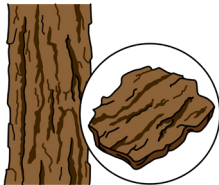


You should clean up

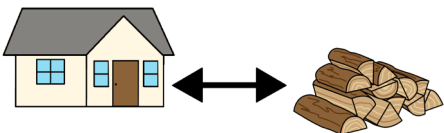
- leaves

- under windows.



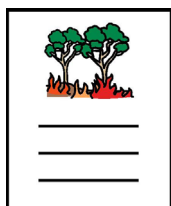
You should

- cut back tree branches near buildings

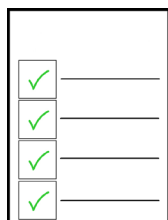


- clean leaves out of the gutters on your house.

It is a good idea to have a **bushfire plan**.

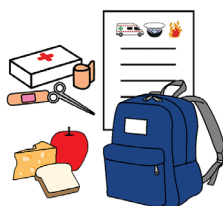


A bushfire plan says what you will do if there is a bushfire near you.

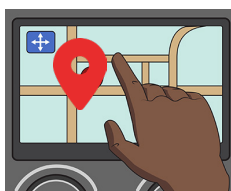


You can write in your bushfire plan

- what you will take

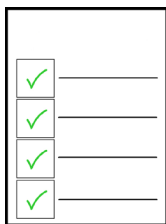


- where you will go

You should tell people what your plan says.

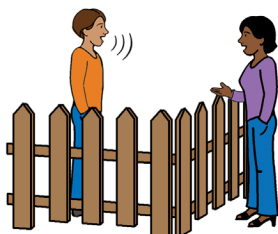


You can tell

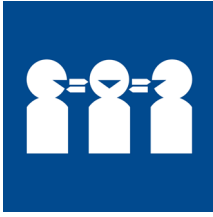

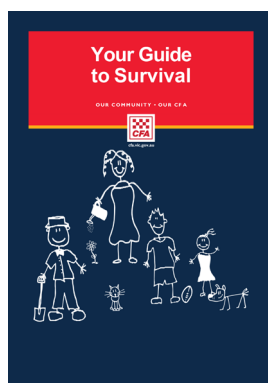
